By now, everyone should have received an email from the Staff Support Committee inviting you to join the Staff Support Google Classroom. If you did not receive an email notification, it is likely because Google Classroom notifications are shut off. To access the classroom you can follow the steps below:

- 1. Go to http://www.classroom.google.com
- 2. Click the "+" button on the top right corner of the page
- Click "Join Class"
- 4. When prompted to enter a code, enter 4xta44l
- 5. Once you are in the room, use the "Classwork" tab to access the resources available during this time.

Last week, a survey was sent to the parents of students at all four locations of the Programs of WPSD. Overall, parents have provided very positive responses, comments, and suggestions regarding how we can make distance learning even more effective for them and their children. Although some parents did comment that distance learning has been difficult for themselves and their child, many provided comments thanking the schools, the teachers, and the related service providers for the amount of parent/teacher communication that they have been receiving, the assigned learning activities that have been assigned, the use of technology, and how we are supporting their children's mental health needs during distance learning. Keep up the amazing work that you are already doing and please know that the parents recognize how well you are meeting their needs and the needs of their children.

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic, an in-person graduation ceremony is scheduled for Saturday, June 13th. To maintain in compliance with social distancing guidelines, graduation will occur in a modified format. Graduates and their families will not gather in the auditorium as in the past, but will be assigned to specific classrooms where they will remain until it is their time to enter the auditorium and walk on stage. We will conduct graduation in 15-minute time slots, with five minutes in between to disinfect areas where graduates and their families were seated. Kindergarten graduation will be celebrated virtually on June 10 at 2:30. Each student will be introduced and recognized for their accomplishments. We will host First Grade Orientation on the afternoon of June 4.

FSA: Reminder: All staff enrolled in the FSA program, please remember that part of the <u>CARES Act</u> (COVID-3 Stimulus Bill), permits the coverage for Over-the-Counter (OTC) medications and drugs for reimbursement from our FSAs accounts. **These items can be purchased with funds from eligible accounts without needing a prescription.** If you have any questions regarding this new "temporary" addition to our FSA Account, please do not hesitate to contact Dori Bachar and she can assist with questions or reimbursements.
